TREATMENTS ENCOMPASSED

IMPORTANCE and JUSTIFICATION for the FOUNDATION'S WORK

- Biotherapeutic medicine is centuries old; thousands of practitioners are using these medical treatments in their practices today
- Few medical schools and training programs (whether allopathic or homeopathic) teach biotherapeutic modalities
- Practitioners of most biotherapeutic modalities have no where else to turn to for education, competency assessment or accreditation
- There is little private or governmental investment in biotherapy research, development or infrastructure
- Patients and therapists need an organization like the BTER Foundation to advocate on their behalf
